Mystery: Professor Says Alleged UFO Has Been Terrorizing Indigenous Communities in Acre

Indigenous professor Airton Silva de Oliveira told ContilNet that an Unidentified Flying Object (UFO) is terrorizing the Nova Floresta and Cocoaçu villages, located on the Alto Rio Envira, in the municipality of Feijó. "I spent three nights pastoring. It was a small machine, which turned on red, blue and green lights", reported the Indian, adding that the UFO gave off the odor of a burnt tire.

Last week, the professor rescued the Indian Iaka Ashanika, who was hit by a discharge from an alleged "flying saucer", after having fired 18 shots in the direction of the object. "He was moving very fast, in all directions," Airton said. "Nobody is able to sleep in the villages. We are terrified of that strange thing, which is not a drone", assures the professor.

The news has spread throughout the city and is already attracting the presence of ufologists, as reported by radio broadcaster Antônio Messias: "The Indians thought it was a drone, but because it burned the nozzles of all the lanterns and emitted strong electric discharges, they stayed terrified.". said Messias, stating

that the Ashaninka people of Alto Evira do not consume hallucinogenic drink known as hoasca.

Retired professor at the Federal University of Acre (UFAC) Izan Carvalho de Melo would also have seen a UFO with the same characteristics, this time on the margins of BR-364, in the direction of Manoel Urbano-Feijó. According to Antônio Messias, the researcher has the habit of camping in the region's forests.
